1. The Overland Park Police Department's Cyber Crimes Unit has been utilizing one personal computer purchased in 2003, for all covert investigations. Due to needed technological upgrades, we are requesting the funding to purchase a new Dell personal computer, to enhance our ability to investigate online child exploitation.
2. In 2010, the Overland Park Police Department will have one detective assigned to the Federal Cyber Crimes Taskforce located in Kansas City, Missouri, and two full-time Cyber Crimes detectives investigating on-line child exploitation. The in-house detectives will be utilizing the requested Dell personal computer. In addition, with approval and available funding, the Overland Park Police Department is hoping to send one of the full-time Cyber Crimes detective's to the 2010 ICAC National Training Conference. None of the Cyber Crimes investigators have attended an ICAC National Conference.

3. The Overland Park Police Department has fully participated as an affiliate to the Kansas Internet Crimes Against Children Taskforce since signing the initial MOU in 2006. The Overland Park Police

Department has complied with all Internet Crimes Against Children guidelines to include the reporting of activity via the ICAC Monthly Performance Measures Report. The ICAC guidelines specifically state, "Carefully managed undercover operations conducted by well-trained officers are among the most effective techniques available to law enforcement for addressing ICAC offenses." As such, the attendance of our Cyber Crimes investigator at the 2010 ICAC National Training Conference will enhance our Agencies investigative ability to combat the plague of online child exploitation. The Overland Park Police Department's Cyber Crimes Unit initiates Peer to Peer investigations located within the City of Overland Park and the surrounding Cities within Johnson County, Kansas. We fully participate with the Kansas ICAC, and have worked cooperatively with ICAC members in the State of Missouri and beyond. Despite the current economic conditions, the Overland Park Police Department continues to combat online exploitation using dedicated supervisors and investigators.
