

**CITY OF OVERLAND PARK  
 NOTICE OF AVAILABILITY FOR REVIEW AND COMMENT ON THE CITY'S  
 FY 2011 ANNUAL ACTION PLAN  
 FISCAL YEAR (FY) 2011 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) PROGRAM**

Notice is hereby given to all interested agencies, groups and residents of Overland Park that the city's FY 2011 CDBG Annual Action Plan is available for review and comment.

The FY 2011 Annual Plan is part of the 2010-2014 Non-Housing Community Development Plan. As stated in the 5-year plan the city's primary non-housing goal is to spend an estimated \$1.75 million for infrastructure improvements in CDBG eligible areas of our city. These funds have been identified as anticipated expenditures in the city's Capital Improvement Program. Other grants, depending on the availability of CDBG funds, may be considered based on proposals received by the city during the annual allocation process that normally begins in March of each year.

The FY 2011 Annual Action Plan reports to the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development the programs the city intends to support during 2011 to assist persons of low-to moderate-income. CDBG funds are the primary financial resources available to meet these needs. The city anticipates receiving \$650,000 in CDBG funds in 2011. The 2011 CDBG Citizens' Advisory Committee is recommending to the City Council the following use of these funds:

1. Neighborhood Improvement (Street Improvement Program): <i>80th Street to 81<sup>st</sup> Street between Broadmoor to Lamar Streets</i>	\$350,000
2. SAFEHOME, Inc.- Purchase & Install AC/Heater units	17,276
3. Johnson County Housing Services- Minor Home Rehabilitation Program	85,224
4. Johnson County Interfaith Hospitality Network-Homeless Services	7,812
5. Goodwill Industries- Job Search Support	9,784
6. Johnson County Park & Recreation- Summer Day Camp Scholarships	28,500
7. Head Start of Shawnee Mission, Inc.- Childcare Scholarships	20,000
8. Catholic Charities- Emergency Financial Assistance	15,000
9. Overland Park- Community Center and swim memberships	4,687
10. The Family Conservancy- Family Support Services	11,717
11. Program Administration	<u>100,000</u>

**\*FOOTNOTES:**

1. If the FY 2011 grant exceeds \$650,000, the committee recommends the additional funds first be applied to Johnson County Housing Services to fully fund their request and then in equal amounts to fully fund the four requests that were not fully funded, up to and in consideration of the 15% Public Service limitation. If there are remaining funds to be allocated, the committee will reconvene to form recommendations for allocation.
2. If the FY 2011 grant is under \$650,000, the committee recommends decreasing the funds proportionally from the Housing Projects, Public Service Projects and the Street Project.

The FY 2011 Annual Action Plan will be available for review and comment for 30 days following the publication of this notice.
